Don't Let Your ISO Registration Expire!



All ISO 9001:2008 and ISO 14001:2004 registrations will expire on September 15, 2018! Make sure you meet the ISO 2015 requirements. API cannot extend this deadline.

To prevent the expiration of your Certificate(s) of Registration, you must successfully transition to ISO 9001:2015 and/or ISO 14001:2015 before September 15, 2018. Transitioning to the 2015 edition(s) of the specification(s) requires:

- Undergoing a successful management system audit to the requirements of ISO 9001:2015 and/or ISO 14001:2015 **and**;

- If API determines that a re-audit is necessary, undergoing a successful re-audit **and**;
- Addressing any nonconformances in myCerts with appropriate correction(s), root cause analysis, and corrective action(s) **and**;
- Review of the audit(s) by API's Licensing and Registration Committee and granting of a certification decision.

Completing all these steps may take several months! API strongly encourages facilities to implement all the requirements of ISO 9001:2015 and/or ISO 14001:2015 prior to their next upcoming audit.

Registrations not transitioned before September 15, 2018 will expire.
