May 6, 2024






Figure 3: The Average Price of Gasoline by Region, compared to US Average May 6, 2024






Figure 4: The Average Price of Gasoline by States, compared to US Average May 6, 2024






Figure 5: The Average Price of Gasoline by Cities, compared to US Average May 6, 2024







Figure 6: Top 5 States with Highest Price of Gasoline May 6, 2024

Figure 7: Top 5 Cities with Highest Price of Gasoline May 6, 2024





Figure 8: High, Low, and 2023 Current Week Prices

Figure 9: Change in Gasoline Prices Spring 2024: March 04, 2024 - May 06, 2024







Figure 10: Change in Gasoline Prices Since Record High
