

New ozone regulations set just a few years ago are working, safeguarding public health – a goal we all share.

The EPA itself reports ozone levels have fallen 18% since 2000.

The EPA shows that since 1970, the nation's air quality has improved while the population, the economy, energy use and miles driven increased greatly. Even as the economy grows, levels of the six most common pollutants continue to drop.

Current standards – the strictest ever – are cutting pollution right now. We should let them work.
