
Methodology

Do you support or oppose increased production of domestic oil and natural gas resources located here in the U.S.?







How important to you is producing more oil and natural gas here at home?







Do you support or oppose increased development of the country's energy infrastructure?







Do you think the federal government does enough to encourage the development of the country's energy infrastructure?










