Dear Mr. Speaker and Leader Pelosi:

On behalf of the American Petroleum Institute (API), I write today in support of HR. 5682, a bill to approve the Keystone XL Pipeline and encourage expeditious passage of this legislation.

This legislation represents the strong bipartisan support the project has long received among Americans. Recent polls continue to show nearly 75% of voters, a majority of both Democrats and Republicans, support putting our labor forces to work and finally building the Keystone XL Pipeline. However, after over six years and five completed federal reviews confirming the safety of the pipeline and the thousands of jobs that would be created, the president still continues to delay this project. Now is the time for Democrats and Republicans to come together and demonstrate leadership by moving this project forward.

According to the State Department's own estimate, the Keystone XL Pipeline will create over 42,000 jobs and put over \$2 billion in workers' pockets at a time when our construction work force continues to face an unemployment rate higher than the national average. In addition, the pipeline will also enhance our energy security by strengthening our relationship with our closest, most reliable ally, Canada. America can no longer afford to wait for this project.

We commend the effort by Congress to advance this long overdue project. We look forward to continuing to work with you to move this bipartisan legislation to the president's desk and finally putting thousands of Americans to work.
