

PETROLEUM FACTS AT A GLANCE – June 2011 release

1. U.S. petroleum imports (crude & products) in May 2011: 10,938,000 barrels per day (May 2010: 12,100,000 b/d). [API]
2. Total imports in May 2011 as a percentage of total domestic petroleum deliveries: 56.0 percent (May 2010: 64.3 percent). [API]
3. Persian Gulf petroleum imports in March 2011 as a percentage of total imports: 18.3 percent (March 2010: 15.8 percent). [DOE]
4. Average price for a barrel of OPEC crude oil for May 2011: \$101.36. [DOE]
5. Average U.S. refiner acquisition cost in March 2011 for a barrel of crude oil: \$102.50. [DOE]
6. U.S. crude oil production in May 2011: 5,380,000 b/d (of which 615,000 b/d was Alaskan) (May 2010: 5,468,000 b/d). U.S. production of natural gas liquids in May 2011: 2,037,000 b/d (May 2010: 2,019,000 b/d). [API]
7. U.S. marketed natural gas production in March 2011: 64.84 billion cubic feet per day (March 2010: 61.47 billion cf/d). [DOE]
8. U.S. deliveries from primary storage of motor gasoline in May 2011: 9,105,000 b/d (May 2010: 9,217,000 b/d). [API]

9. U.S. deliveries from primary storage of distillate fuel oil (home heating and diesel) in May 2011: 3,891,000 b/d (May 2010: 3,635,000 b/d). [API]

10. Total petroleum products delivered to the domestic market in May 2011: 19,526,000 b/d (May 2010: 18,827,000 b/d). [API]
