

PETROLEUM FACTS AT A GLANCE – February 2010

1. U.S. petroleum imports (crude & products) in January 2010: 11,339,000 barrels per day (January 2009: 13,173,000 b/d). [API]
2. Total imports in January 2010 as a percentage of total domestic petroleum deliveries: 61.6 percent (January 2009: 68.9 percent). [API]
3. Persian Gulf petroleum imports in November 2009 as a percentage of total imports: 17.3 percent (November 2008: 20.4 percent). [DOE]
4. Average price for a barrel of OPEC crude oil for the week ending January 29, 2010: \$71.97 [DOE]
5. Average U.S. refiner acquisition cost in December 2009 for a barrel of crude oil: \$72.95. [DOE]
6. U.S. crude oil production in January 2010: 5,446,000 b/d (of which 698,000 b/d was Alaskan) (January 2009: 5,137,000 b/d). U.S. production of natural gas liquids in January 2010: 2,077,000 b/d (January 2009: 1,721,000 b/d). [API]
7. U.S. marketed natural gas production in November 2009: 60.6 billion cubic feet per day (November 2008: 59.3 billion cf/d). [DOE]
8. U.S. deliveries from primary storage of motor gasoline in January 2010: 8,770,000 b/d (January 2009: 8,690,000 b/d). [API]
9. U.S. deliveries from primary storage of distillate fuel oil (home heating and diesel) in January 2010: 3,578,000 b/d (January 2009: 4,075,000 b/d). [API]
10. Total petroleum products delivered to the domestic market in January 2010: 18,407,000 b/d (January 2009: 19,125,000 b/d). [API]
11. Average active rotary drilling rigs in the U.S. as of February 12, 2010: 1,346 (all-time high of 4,530 announced 12/28/81; record low of 488 announced 4/23/99). (2009 average: 1,089) [Baker Hughes Inc., Houston]

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
