

PETROLEUM FACTS AT A GLANCE – April 2011

1. U.S. petroleum imports (crude & products) in March 2011: 11,300,000 barrels per day (March 2010: 11,588,000 b/d). [API]
2. Total imports in March 2011 as a percentage of total domestic petroleum deliveries: 54.5 percent (March 2010: 60.8 percent). [API]
3. Persian Gulf petroleum imports in January 2011 as a percentage of total imports: 11.4 percent (January 2010: 13.8 percent). [DOE]
4. Average price for a barrel of OPEC crude oil for the week ending April 5, 2011: \$108.34 [DOE]
5. Average U.S. refiner acquisition cost in February 2011 for a barrel of crude oil: \$89.40. [DOE]
6. U.S. crude oil production in March 2011: 5,547,000 b/d (of which 647,000 b/d was Alaskan) (March 2010: 5,532,000 b/d). U.S. production of natural gas liquids in March 2011: 2,053,000 b/d (March 2010: 2,020,000 b/d). [API]
7. U.S. marketed natural gas production in January 2011: 63.5 billion cubic feet per day (January 2010: 59.7 billion cf/d). [DOE]
8. U.S. deliveries from primary storage of motor gasoline in March 2011: 9,324,000 b/d (March 2010: 8,787,000 b/d). [API]
9. U.S. deliveries from primary storage of distillate fuel oil (home heating and diesel) in March 2011: 4,277,000 b/d (March 2010: 3,842,000 b/d). [API]
10. Total petroleum products delivered to the domestic market in March 2011: 20,462,000 b/d (March 2010: 19,070,000 b/d). [API]
