

PETROLEUM FACTS AT A GLANCE – January 2011

1. U.S. petroleum imports (crude & products) in December 2010: 10,607,000 barrels per day (December 2009: 10,518,000 b/d). [API]
2. Total imports in December 2010 as a percentage of total domestic petroleum deliveries: 54.4 percent (December 2009: 54.6 percent). [API]
3. Persian Gulf petroleum imports in October 2010 as a percentage of total imports: 13.3 percent (October 2009: 17.8 percent). [DOE]
4. Average price for a barrel of OPEC crude oil for the week ending January 7, 2010: \$88.07 [DOE]
5. Average U.S. refiner acquisition cost in October 2010 for a barrel of crude oil: \$77.77. [DOE]
6. U.S. crude oil production in December 2010: 5,524,000 b/d (of which 652,000 b/d was Alaskan) (December 2009: 5,451,000 b/d). U.S. production of natural gas liquids in December 2010: 2,033,000 b/d (December 2009: 1,959,000 b/d). [API]
7. U.S. marketed natural gas production in October 2010: 62.7 billion cubic feet per day (October 2009: 60.3 billion cf/d). [DOE]
8. U.S. deliveries from primary storage of motor gasoline in December 2010: 8,857,000 b/d (December 2009: 8,931,000 b/d). [API]
9. U.S. deliveries from primary storage of distillate fuel oil (home heating and diesel) in December 2010: 4,128,000 b/d (December 2009: 3,861,000 b/d). [API]
10. Total petroleum products delivered to the domestic market in December 2010: 19,471,000 b/d (December 2009: 19,237,000 b/d). [API]
