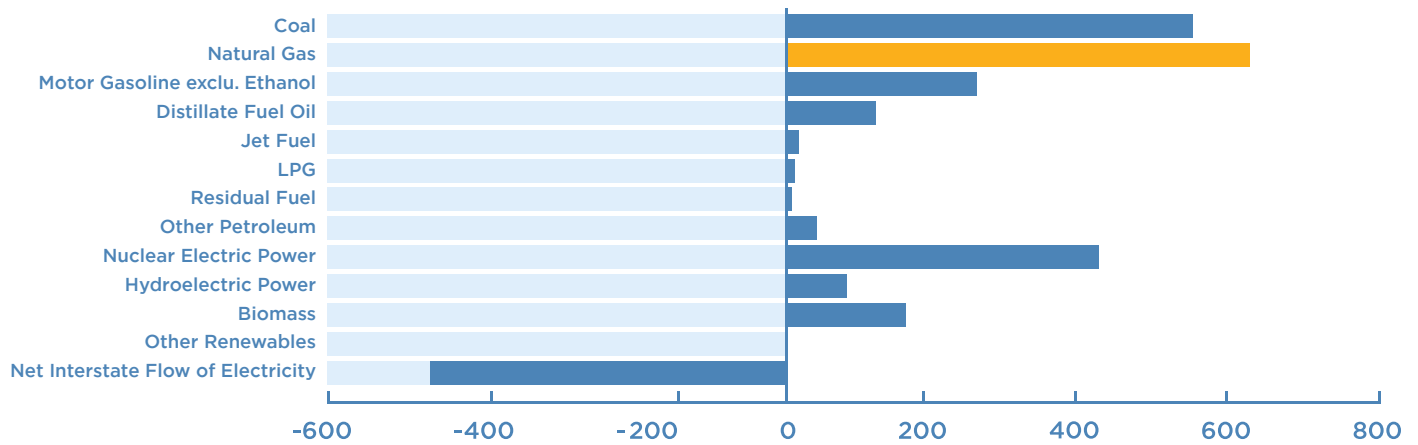


# ALABAMA

U.S. ENERGY INFORMATION ADMINISTRATION CONSUMPTION ESTIMATES (Trillion Btu), 2014



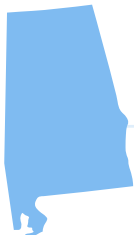

Alabama ranks #17 in the number of producing natural gas wells.

Because of its significant manufacturing base, Alabama’s per capita energy use is above the national average. This is reflected in natural gas’ leading role in electricity generation, 36.8 percent in 2015. Alabama also ranks among the top five states for electricity generation from biomass.



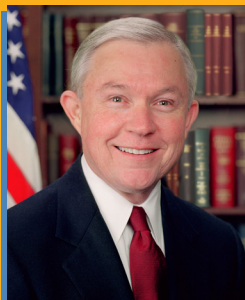
## THE IMPACTS OF ENERGY POLICY CHOICES
