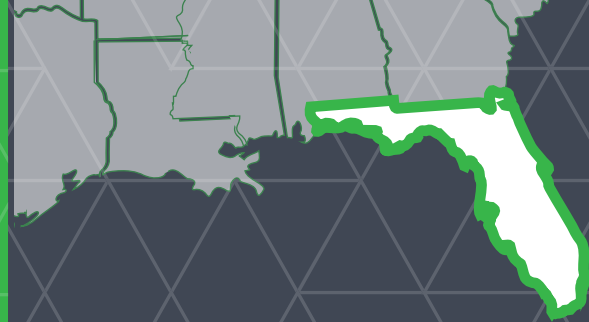

Plastic frames and lenses (polycarbonate or polyurethane).

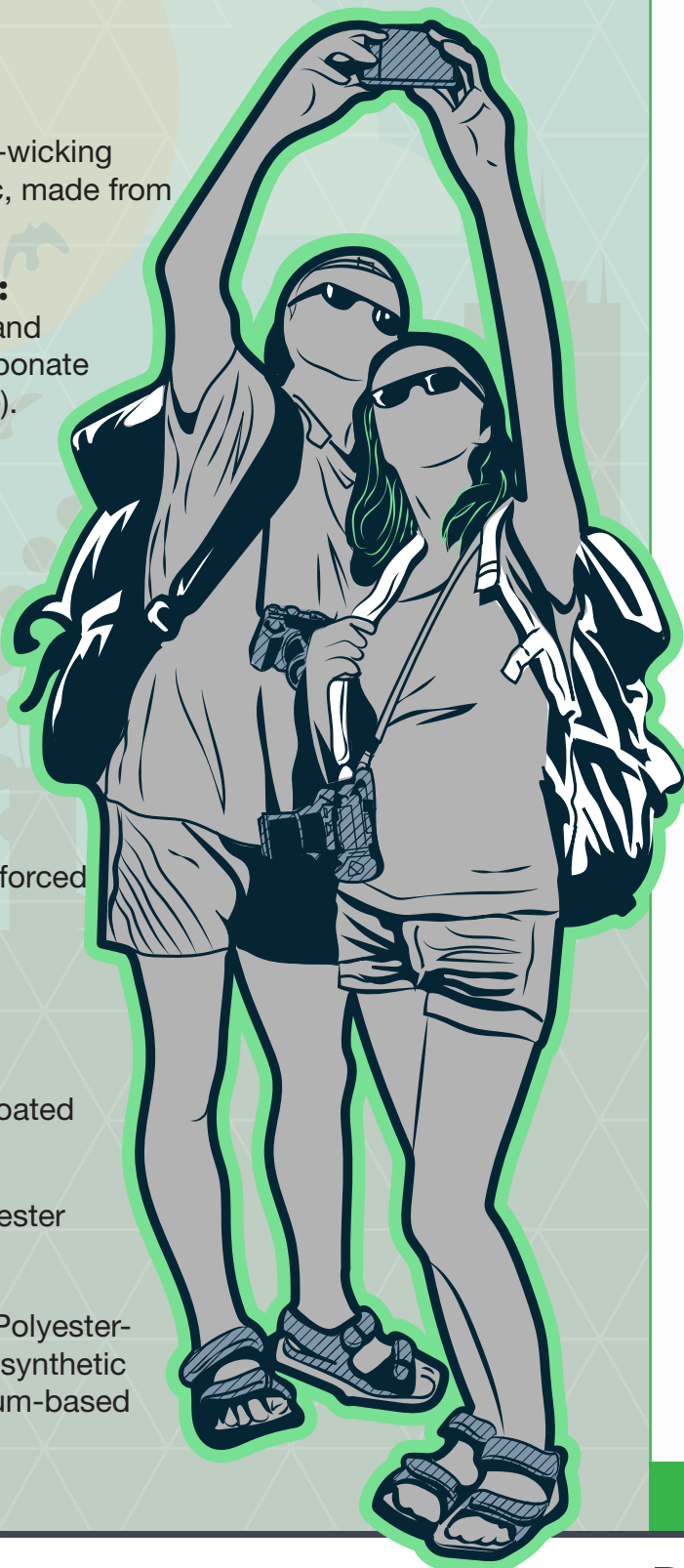
CAMERA: Reinforced polycarbonate chassis, plastic viewfinder.

In virtually every human activity and invention, energy plays an important role: powering, building and improving the quality of everyday life.

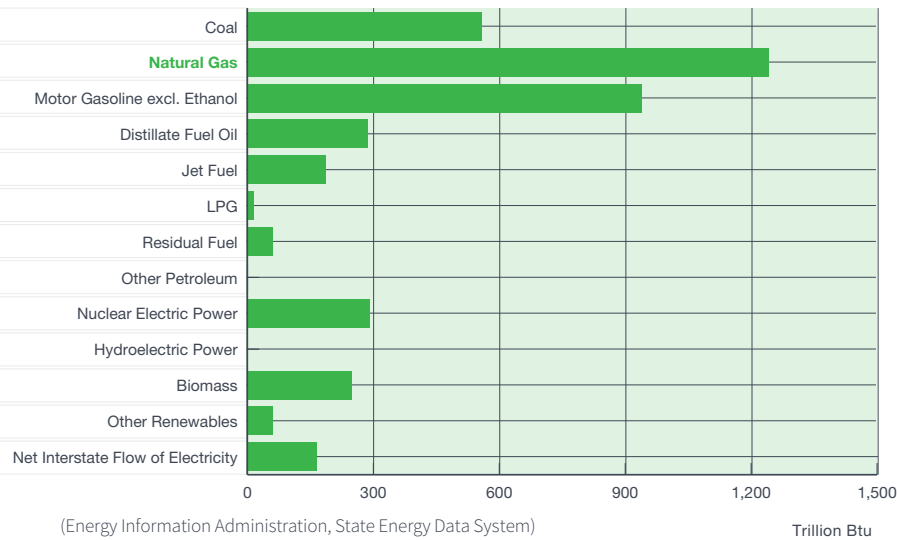

QUICK FACTS:

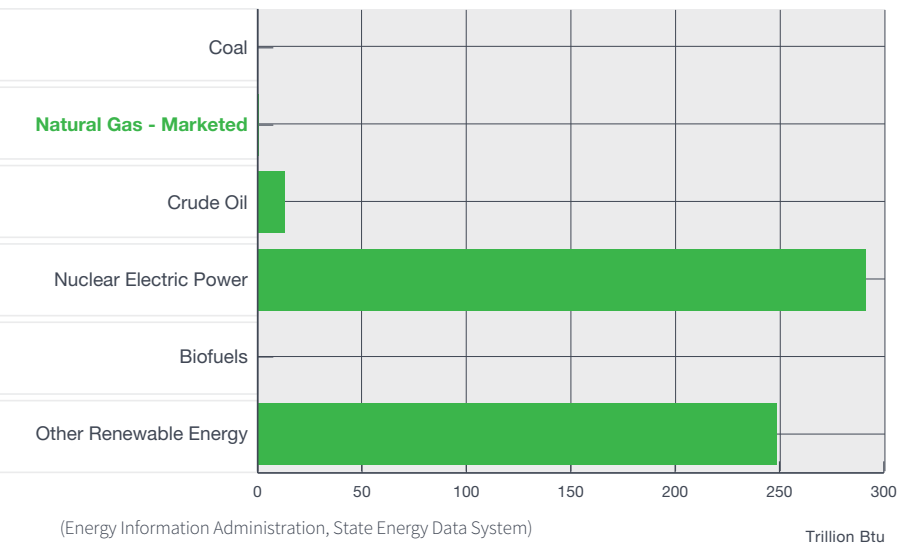
- Florida welcomed nearly **113 million** visitors in 2016, according to state officials.

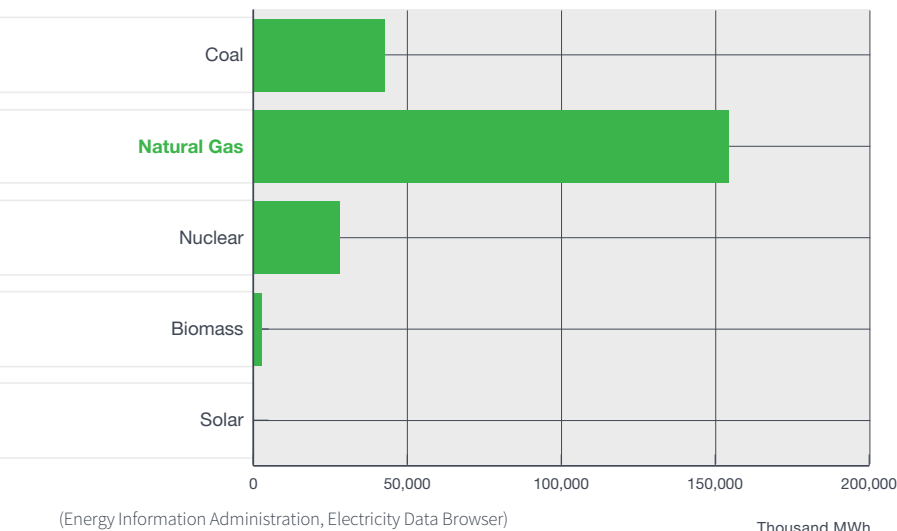
FLORIDA ENERGY CONSUMPTION ESTIMATES, 2014
