Tour guides participate in workshops on cultural traditions and history with special guest historians and Native Tribal members as continual professional development. You will cover three city blocks of historic Pioneer Square, exploring underground passageways originally constructed in the 1890's. The best of the Pioneer Square neighborhood will be showcased. Bring comfortable walking shoes.
