

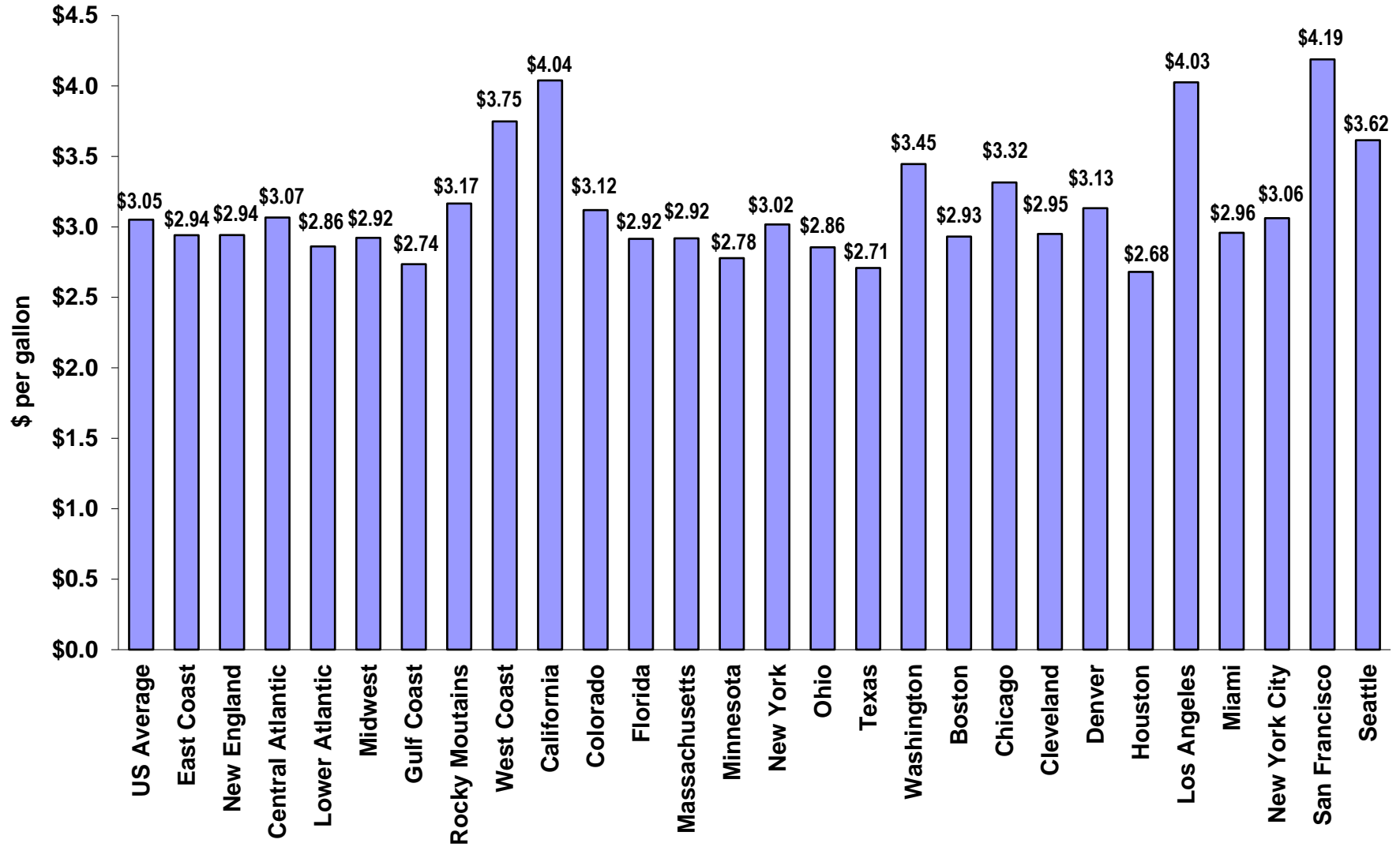
Figure 1: Change in Gasoline Prices (All Grades and Formulations)

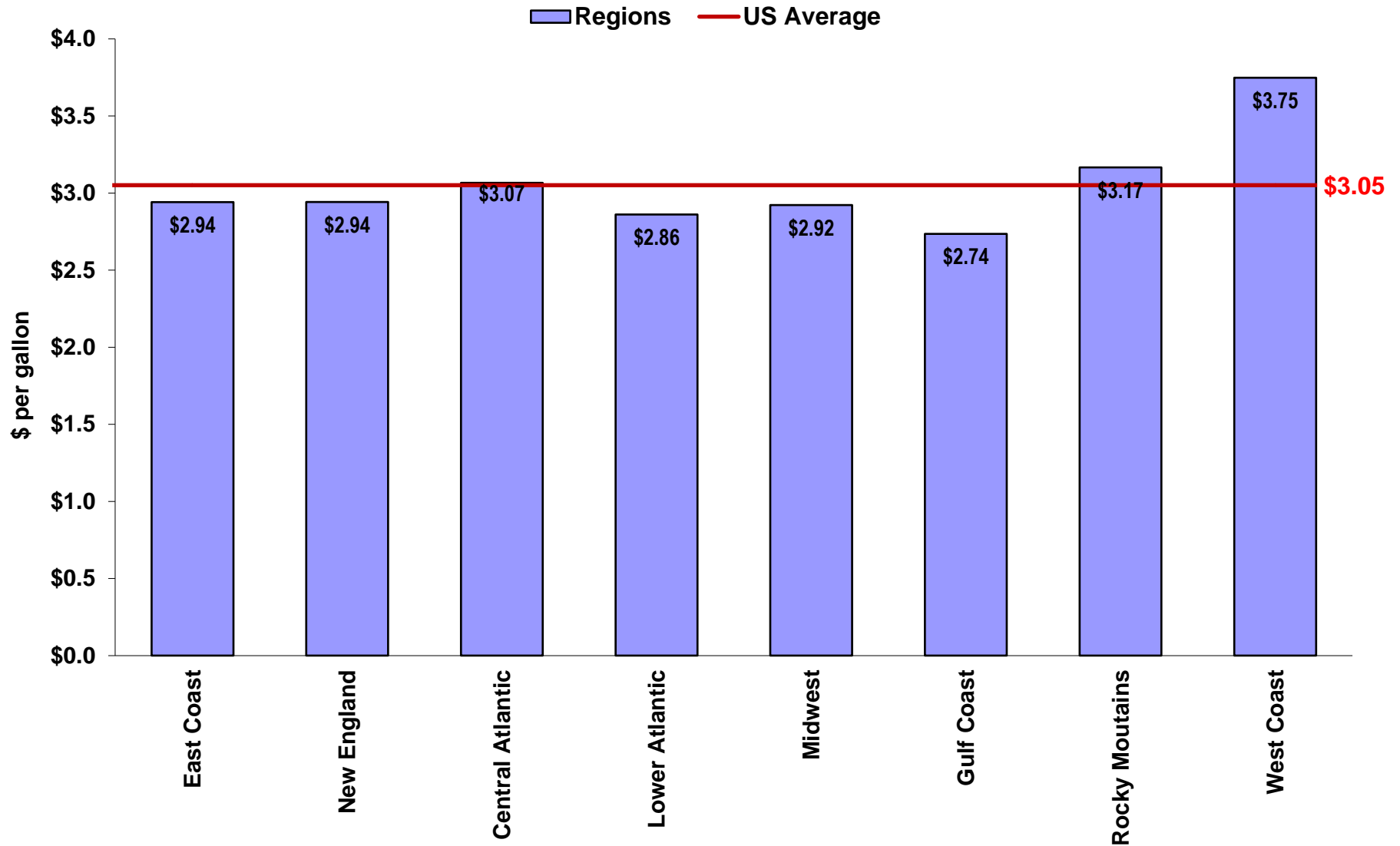
**Figure 2: The Average Price of Gasoline (All Grades and Formulations),

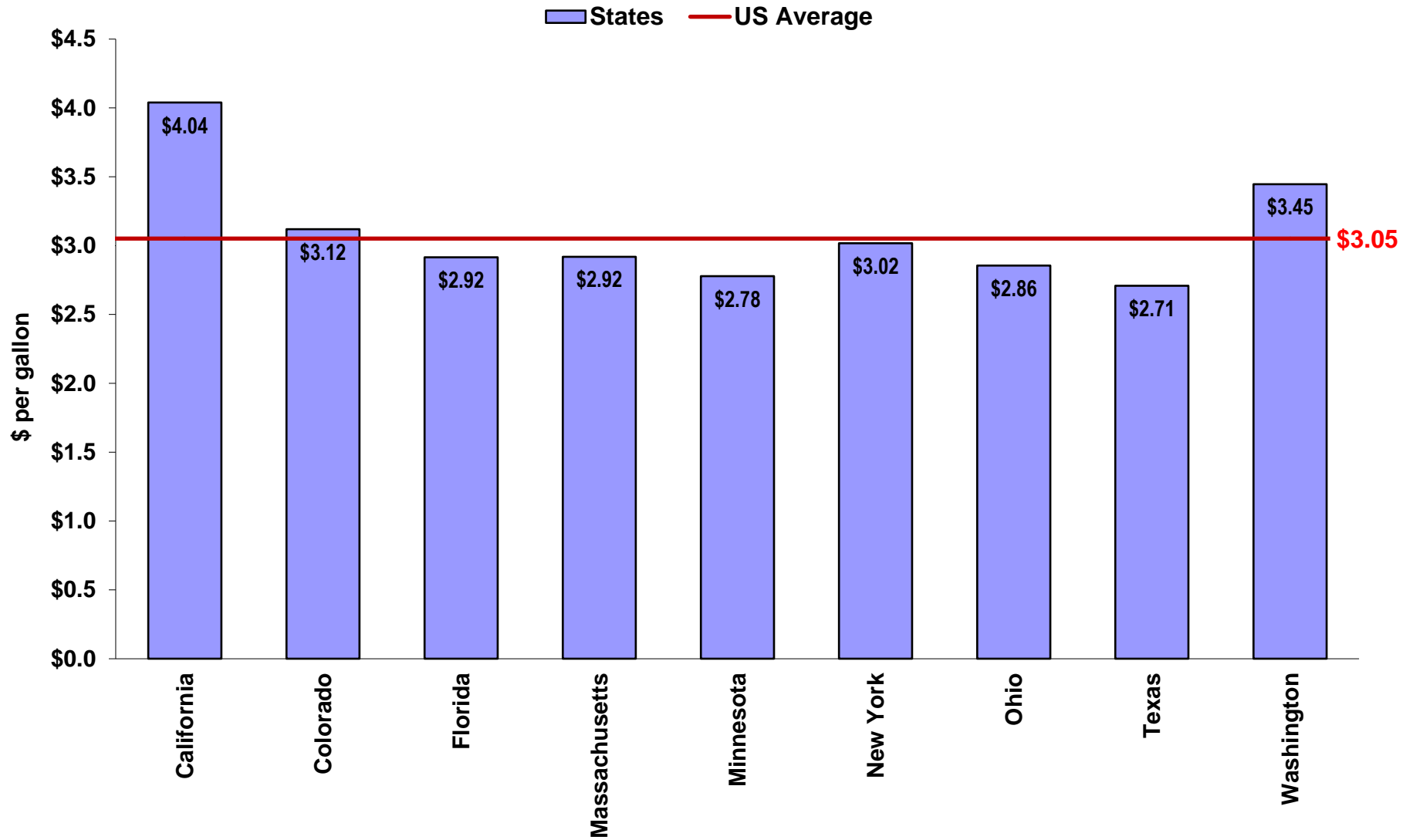
**Figure 3: The Average Price of Gasoline by Region, compared to US Average

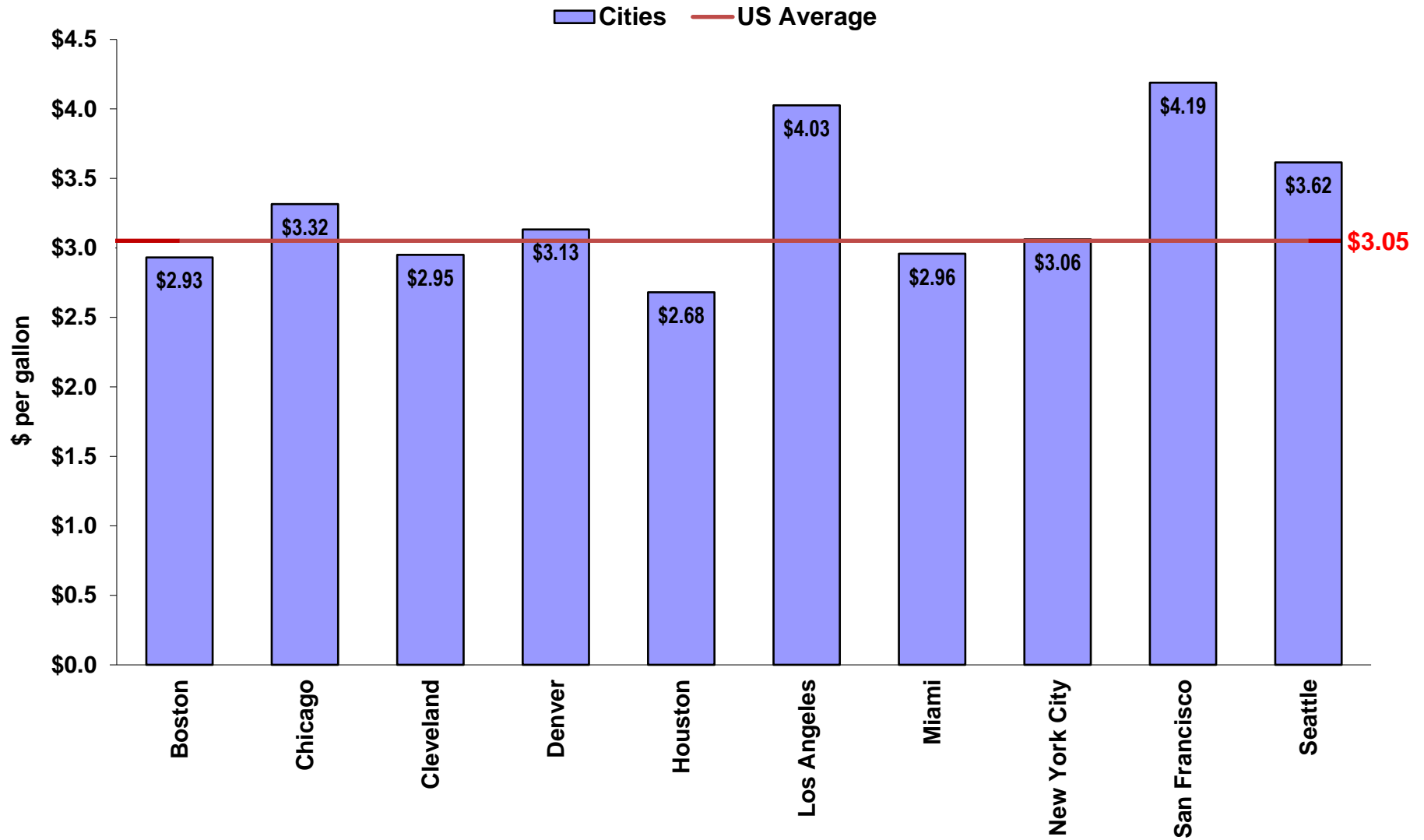
**Figure 4: The Average Price of Gasoline by States, compared to US Average

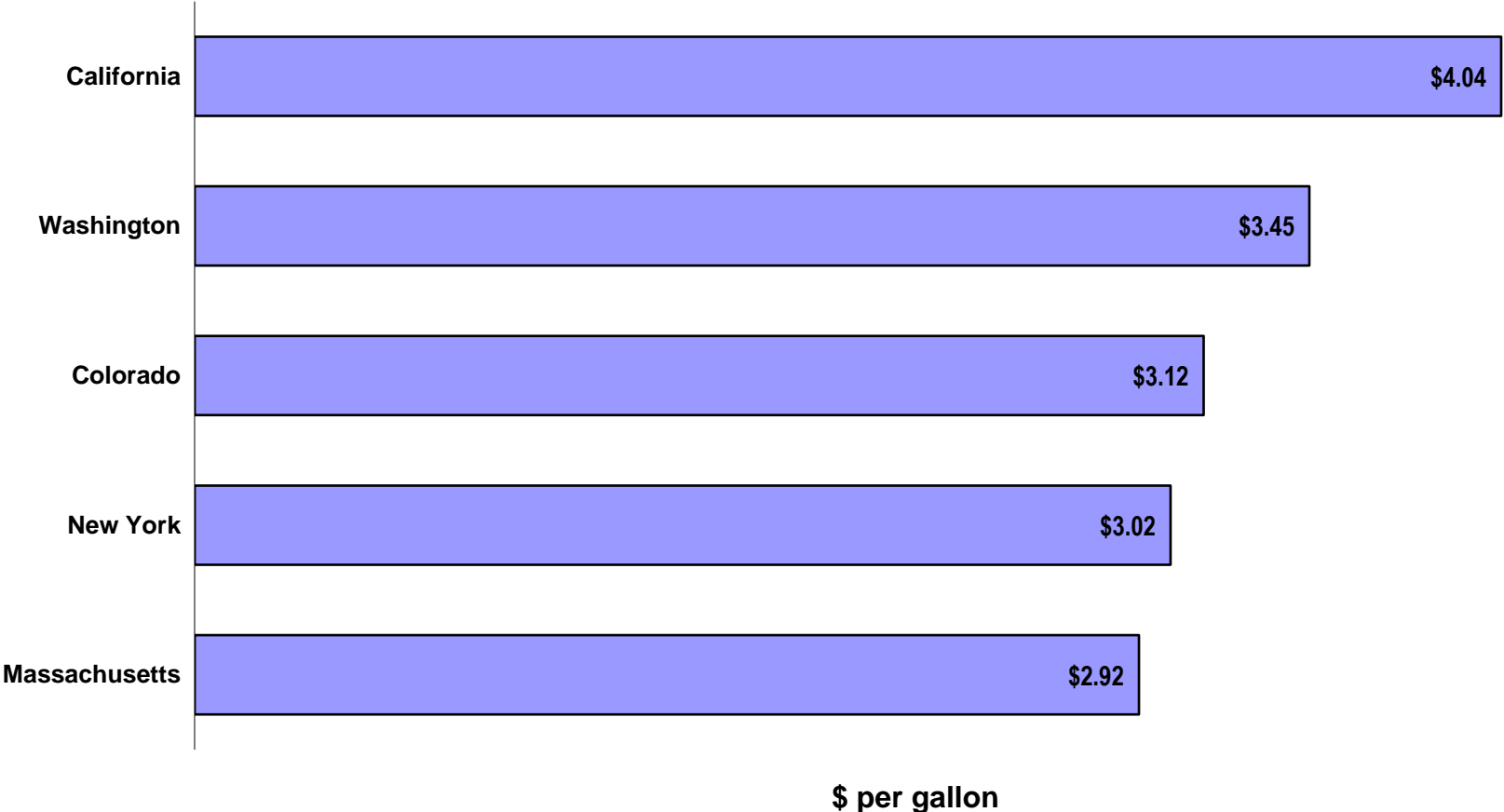
**Figure 5: The Average Price of Gasoline by Cities, compared to US Average

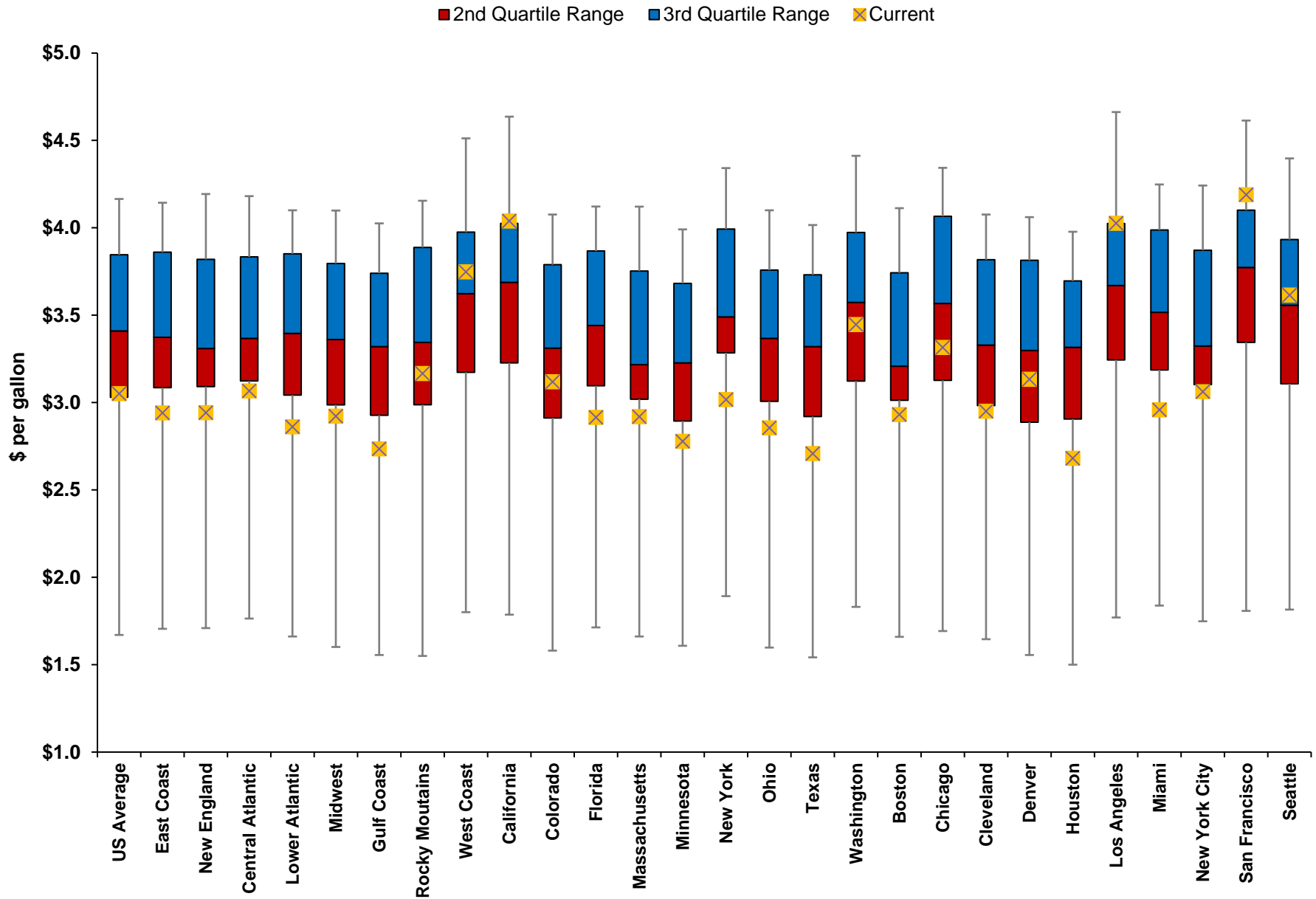

Figure 8: 2008 High, Low, and 2021 Current Prices

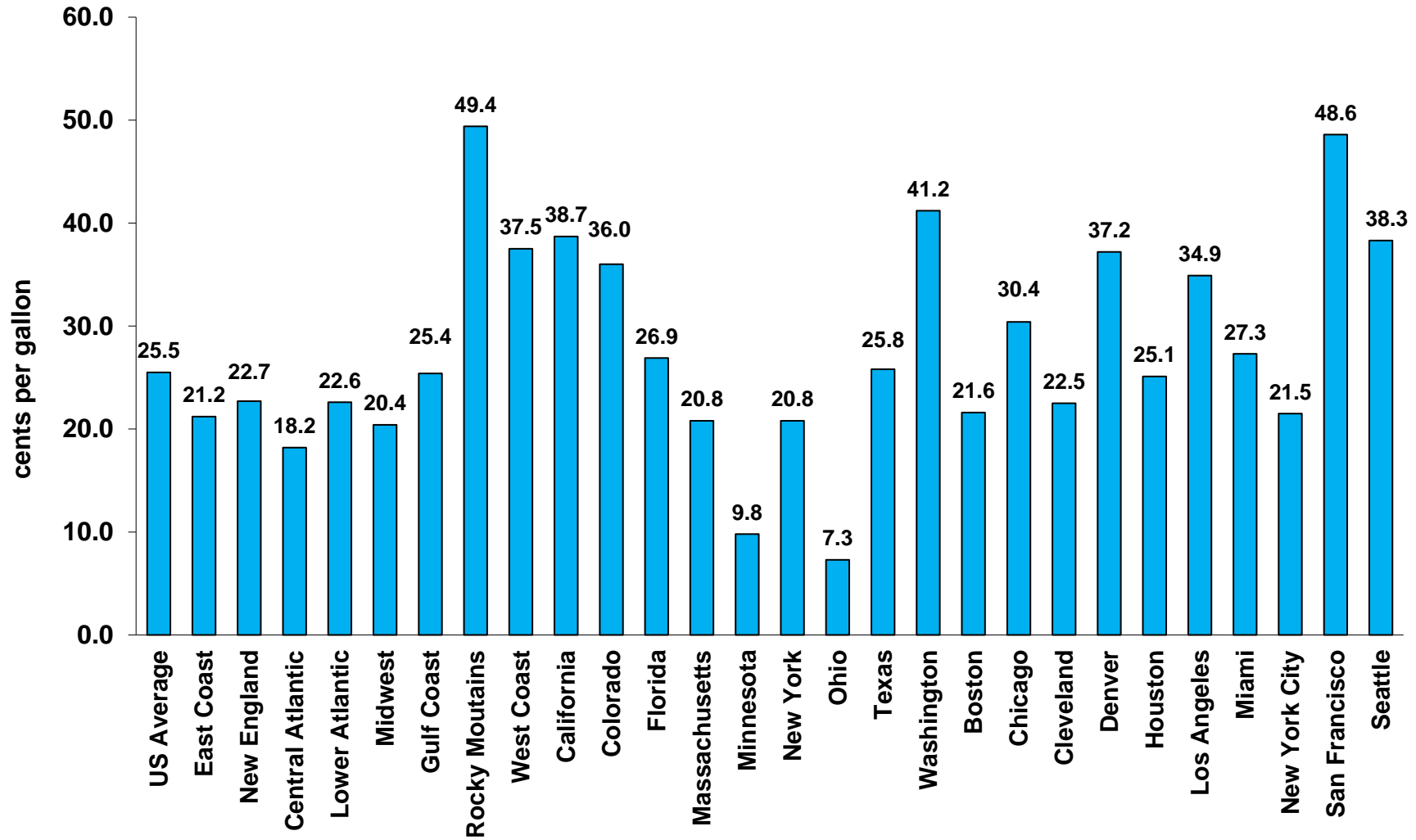

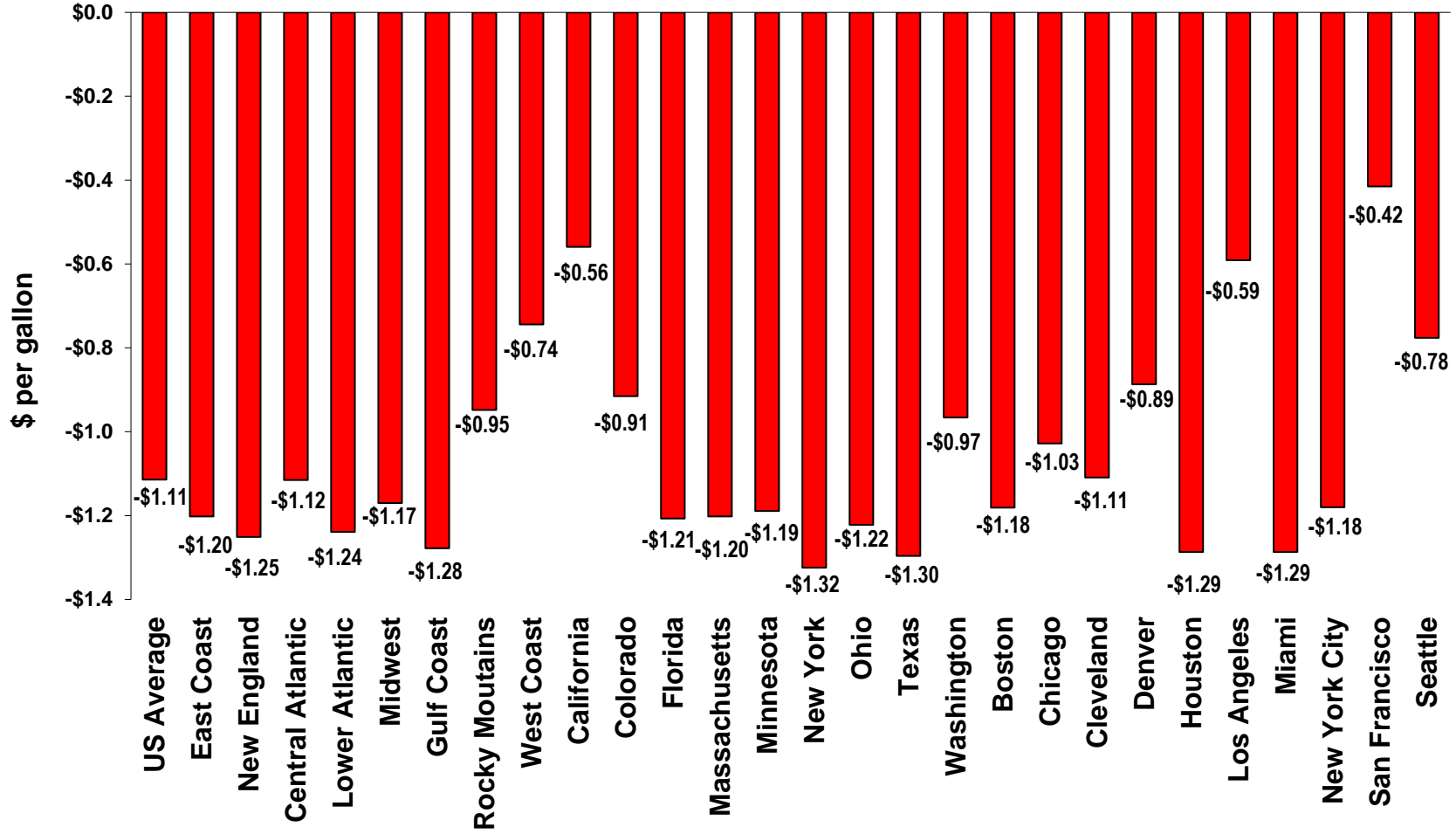
Figure 9: Change in Gasoline Prices Spring 2021: Mar 01, 2021 - May 10, 2021

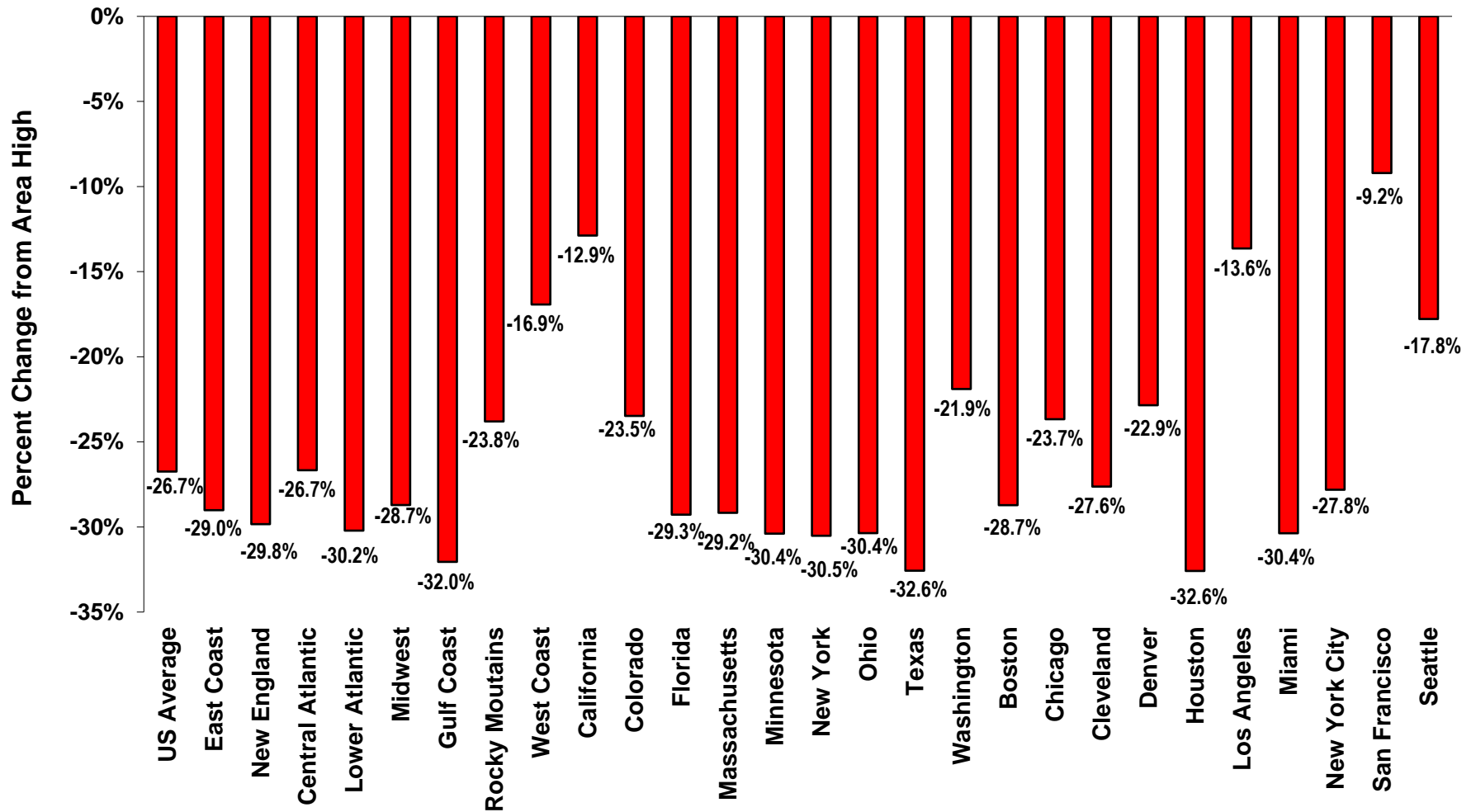
Figure 10: Change in Gasoline Prices Since July 7, 2008 (Record High)
