MICHIGAN VOTERS' VIEWS

Summary of Key Findings

- A large majority of Michigan voters recognize they rely on natural gas and oil in their homes and for transportation.
- The coronavirus has had a huge impact on Michigan's economy, and most voters say the natural gas and oil industry will play an important role in the economic recovery.
- Voters across the board prioritize energy independence, high-paying jobs, and keeping energy prices affordable. A majority of voters say producing natural gas and oil in the U.S. has a positive effect on national security.
- Six in ten Michigan voters, including a majority of Democrats and independents, would be more likely to vote for a candidate who supports access to oil and gas produced in the U.S.

Methodology

This poll was conducted between June 26-July 2, 2020 among a sample of 799 Michigan Registered Voters. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Michigan Registered Voters based on gender, age, educational attainment, race, home ownership, and 2016 Presidential vote. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 3 percentage points.


8 in 10 MI voters say natural gas and oil provide value to them personally; think it will play a large role in America's continued energy needs



Do you rely on natural gas or oil for any of the following on a regular basis? Please check all that apply.





How important of a role do you believe the natural gas and oil industry will have in helping the economy recover from the economic impacts of the coronavirus pandemic?








Do you think producing natural gas and oil here in the U.S. tends to have a mostly positive or mostly negative impact on our country's national security?


